It's in discipleship the Holy Spirit teaches us that we're in spiritual warfare because at the core of our being we're spirit and what we see physically began with God who is Spirit, Rom. 1:19-20. Because God doesn't desire that any should perish nor be ignorant of Satan's devices we're daily encouraged

to pick up the cross of obedience and follow Him because the nature of our warfare isn't against flesh and blood but principalities, spiritual wickedness and other devices of Satan, Eph. 6:11-12. God warns His children not to lean unto their own understanding nor follow after the wisdom of this world from fallen man, 1 Cor. 2; 3:18-23. In Colossians 3:1-17 we're encouraged to set our minds on things above because God is the One who transforms us in and through the power of the Holy Spirit because the nature of our warfare isn't carnal but mighty in God and the only way we're effectively used by God is when we allow God to transform us by the renewing of our mind, Rom. 12:1-2. Our faith in God in and through Christ Jesus is tangible because God is tangible even though He's Spirit and invisible to the natural eye but He's not invisible to the spiritual eye. We're encouraged to keep our eyes upon Jesus because when our eyes are on Him we're looking into the face of eternity, the face of God and only He knows the plans He has for His children that will glorify and honor Him for all to see, Mt. 5:13-16.
